Gospel "John 20:1 – 18" Glory to you, O Lord.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went

into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes. But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew. "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples. "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ. Sermon

Today being Easter, the day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, in our 1st lesson we are reminded that we - who are in the know - are to tell others about this event, and <u>spread</u> this incredibly good news.

The problem for us <u>can be</u> that we don't really know <u>how</u> to spread this good news in a way that others can understand it. It may come out sounding like; "*Jesus died, now he lives. This is a good thing*!" Unfortunately, it doesn't always satisfactorily answer the return question; "*That's nice, but what does it mean*?" For us, it means that because Jesus beat death, we too can beat death! Of course, what we may fail to anticipate is that, anyone who has experienced the death of someone close, may find this news kind of hard to believe. So often people want verifiable proof – and even then, they may be skeptical.

It's up to us then to point to our Holy Scriptures, although these days, the old argument that whatever is in the Bible is true – that argument doesn't strike all as being something they can believe. For a lot of people who have difficulty with the Bible, one may need to ask them if they have ever actually read and studied it. There are a lot of misconceptions out there with regards to our scriptures.

So, when presenting the good news to others, perhaps it's best to treat the Easter message like a trump card; you don't necessarily play it first, you hang on to it until it can be used to full advantage. Even though we possess the best news the world has ever known, there are times when some in the world just aren't ready for it.

Take our gospel lesson as an example. Mary Magdalene goes to the gravesite and finds the tomb is empty. The stone is rolled away. Jesus body is gone. What is she to make of this? She tells 2 of the disciples that there is a body missing but, while they check it out, they don't have any answers for her. So, Mary looks in again, sees and speaks with 2 angels, yet still is convinced that someone stole Jesus body. It's the only answer that fits her mind set at that point in time. She just isn't yet prepared, until she turns around, sees Jesus, first assumes he's the gardener, and asks <u>him</u> where the body went to. Until the minute that Jesus spoke to her, she just wasn't ready for the best news the world has ever known.

There are times then, when it is best to just approach another person and come to them where they are at. Those who are most receptive to the message that God is alive and well and cares deeply about us, are those who have had the worst happen to them, and have discovered that the world doesn't have all the answers it claims to have. This is why Jesus approaches Mary at the point where she is totally bewildered. The world's answers just don't fit into her thinking at the time. Jesus' answers however – do.

And if there is one thing we can say about our world today, it is that people are still looking for answers. Especially hurting people who find that the world doesn't have the answers it claims to have. The kind of people that Jesus hung out with. The people who need a "Jesus app" on their cell phone.

You're familiar with an "app", aren't you? It's a short form for "applications", for those who want to get some extra features out of their cell phones, apparently one makes an internet journey to what is known as an "app store". There I'm told you can download programs that help you to do various things with your cellular phone, like giving you access to buy plane tickets, book a hotel room, download music, or movies so you can enjoy them on your phone. The phrase which made this popular was "*we have an app for that*."

Now, while that may be great for the frivolous things in life, what happens when one comes to realize that there is more to life – but they can't find it? My answer today is "*God has an app for that*".

Do you need guidance in life or wonder where you went wrong? God has an app called "The 10 commandments".

Do you want to know what love is really about? God has an app called "Jesus", who came to show us what it means to love and be loved in the most perfect form.

Do you wonder what your purpose is here on earth or even if you have a purpose? God has an app called "follow me".

Do you feel guilt over something you said or did? God has an app called "forgiveness".

Would you like to talk to God? God has an app for that called "prayer".

Or maybe you are worried about dying and death? Well, God has the <u>ultimate</u> app for that; called *resurrection and eternal life*. And this is what we celebrate today. God offers us not only some answers, but also encouragement and hope for the future. You do however, still have to visit <u>God's</u> app store.

But you don't go to a regular "app store" to find these applications. You don't even need a cell phone. What you need is access to the Word, and God's people, which can be accessed anywhere, any time, and has wider coverage than any cell phone provider on earth. It's also cheaper.

The resurrection we celebrate at Easter is the ultimate app. Our greatest fear, the fear of death is erased. Death has lost its power. Evil has no power to threaten us with death. Those threats have been erased. That's what today is all about. That's why we celebrate with the joyful words; "Christ is risen!"

Surprising God, you offer endless ways for us to delight in your grace. Give this community of faith a sense of joy and wonder in exploring new avenues of faith formation, worship, and discipleship. Merciful God, **receive our prayer.**

Resurrecting God, you make us alive in Christ. Thank you for blessing us with faithful witnesses who now rest in you. Merciful God, **receive our prayer.**

We offer to you these petitions and those we carry in our hearts, trusting in your abundant and ever-present mercy.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
